
How To Use Virtual Tours




Autism West Midlands, local authorities and Google Street View have created these virtual tours to help people with autism prepare their journey and familiarise themselves with new locations.

Use this guide to navigate through the website and the virtual tours.

1. Click on the name button or area on the map which you plan to visit in this guide we will use Walsall as an example.



2. You will directly get to the area page, consisting of a satelite map and buttons of the different venues that have virtual tours in this area.




If you click the "Back to start" button at the top of the page it will take you back to the map of the West Midlands.

3. Once you have clicked on the venue that you want to visit online you will be directed to a new page. This page will have information about the venue as well as an interactive image that you will be able to navigate (an example is shown of Walsall Central Library below).



4. You can use your computer mouse or touch screen to click the arrows on the image to take a look around the venue. The first image that you will see on your screen will be the entrance of

the venue.



If you would like to see a different part of the venue, you can click on a purple button below the image.

Entrance Lobby Area



Click on the - button to zoom out.






- 5. Click on the grey arrow to navigate around the venue. You can click to the left, right, up or down depending on what part of the building you would like to see.
